


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INTERNATIONAL EDUCATION PROGRAM



Supplement to: COMBINED EDUCATION & OPERATIONS POLICY AND

Background:

Live-streaming of New Westminster Schools' public Board meetings occurred temporarily in 2013 through use of the City of New Westminster's Council Chambers and the City's own streaming system. School districts such as Surrey Schools and Richmond School District, have started to use live-stream video to broadcast their public Board meetings. The practice of live-streaming public Board meetings would improve transparency, accountability and enable the public to access the meetings via video.
