1. Project Summary

The existing school facility is approximately 69 years old and it has reached the end of its useful life as well as being classified as H1 high seismic risk. The existing school facility is built on an area that has history of burial usage.

The project consists of design and construction of a 19,837m2 replacement facility on the existing SD owned property, decommissioning of the existing school, and restoration of the site with appropriate memorialization.

2. Project Structure

The Project Team are identified in Appendix 1.

3. Scope

The new school will accommodate more than 1,900 students with 76 teaching units and an allowable school area of 16,390m2, plus Neighbourhood Learning Centre (NLC) space of 2,802m2, and a SD Maintenance/IT facility of 645m2, for a total gross area of 19,837m2 per the CPFA.

There may be sufficient site area to accommodate two playfields and the Maintenance/IT facility is proposed as a stand-alone facility separate from the new school building.

Over the course of May:

- Civil works:
 - New service lines (electrical, water, sewer) installed throughout the foundation of the East Wing (Grand Commons to Sixth Street).
 - Resurfacing of internal service lane (aka 7th Street) from area of project office, northerly to 10th Avenue completed.
 - No archeological/environmental issues.
- Concrete Work area in the north wing has all service lines installed and the concrete slab-on-grade floor for gymnasium was poured on March 20th. East Wing slab-on-grade concrete floor continues in Westerly direction, with the second of three sections completed May 31st.
- **Structural Steel Construction** East Wing of school has significant amount of work completed structural steel, hollow-core floor panels, top-lift concrete on floor. Air-exchange ducting has commenced on Floors 1 & 2.

Looking into June:

- Concrete slab-on-grade floors to continue along East Wing to Grand Commons and Theatre.
- Erecting the **structural steel** ongoing along North Wing towards gymnasium area.
- Placement of "Hollow Core" concrete floor panels in balance of East Wing and then advance to North Wing.
- Maintenance/IT (MIT) Building foundation excavation has commenced.
- **Site workers** current level is 75-80 and this may increase to 160-170 over the next several months.

Notes:

- On-time...On budget.
- No changes to "Risk Summary" all items are "Low Risk".
- Work hours for Graham Design-Builders Monday to Friday from 7:00 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Traffic/Pedestrian/Cycling movements through and around worksite on Municipal streets are operating effectively and safely.

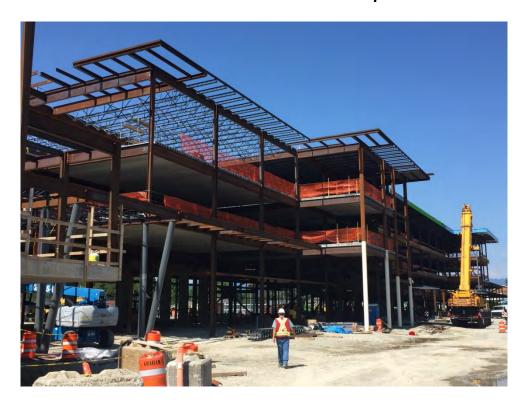

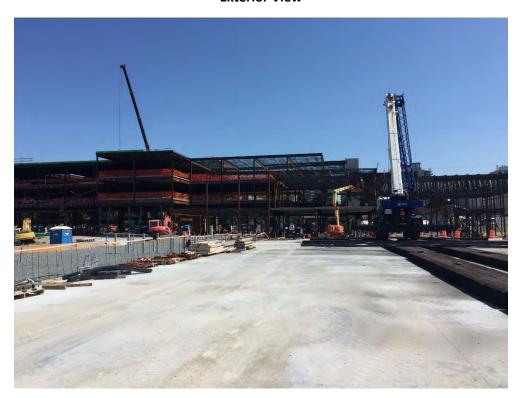

Operations Update *June* 11, 2019

Capital Projects, Operations and Planning

Lord Tweedsmuir Elementary

The Lord Tweedsmuir seismic project is on schedule. Unitech has started the demolition of rooms 108, 111, 206 and 207, and have completed all seismic connections and shear walls. The new sub-flooring has been started and the new air handlers with ducting have also started. Unitech has started on the MDF sheeting of the walls and dry walling of the ceilings. Rooms 109, 203, 204 and Resource Room are completed with new flooring, cabinets, lighting and T-Bar drop ceiling. The students have been moved back into these classrooms. Unitech has poured the slab and footings for the new elevator and the elevator shaft has been built. The framing of the elevator corridors and roofs have started. Unitech has completed all of the crawl space with shear walls and strapping and also poured all the footings. Unitech is ahead of schedule all classrooms anticipated to be ready for September start-up.

All Other Projects

New Westminster Secondary School

The Operations team has connected with school staff to begin planning for the 2020 move to the new building. Plans to date include placement of bins on site during June/July 2019 to begin purging unwanted or surplus items for recycling and landfill, as well as discussions for decommissioning the auto shop and redeploying equipment to other school districts if interested. This decommissioning is a potential revenue generator, with the intent of any potential revenue being targeted to the furniture and equipment budget for the new school.

Herbert Spencer Elementary

Upgrade of new boilers and hot water tanks to on demand system with new pumps and controls will be completed over summer using Annual Facilities Grant (AFG) \$320,000. Floor replacement will also be completed under the School Enhancement Project (SEP) \$170,000 and gym floor refinishing from AFG \$20,000.

Glenbrook Middle

Replacement of gas-fired roof top units with hot water units will occur from June 2019 to March 2020 under SEP funding \$528,000.00 and AFG \$200,000.

Lord Kelvin Elementary

Complete boiler and air handler upgrade from June 2019 to March 2020 SEP project \$900,000 and \$200,000 from AFG. We are also doing Sprinkler piping refit replacing all dry system piping and straps tees from AFG \$50,000

Portables

Plans are underway to move three portables from Tweedsmuir Elementary to Lord Kelvin Elementary (2 portables) and Qayqayt Elementary (1 portable) to attend to growing enrolment. A planned accelerated completion of the Tweedsmuir Elementary seismic project has enabled the District to take advantage of current portable inventory.

Other summer maintenance plans include fire & intrusion alarm replacement and touch pads at all school sites, fire safety plans updated at all sites, replacement of ABC fire extinguishers, and air duct cleaning at Herbert Spencer Elementary & Queensborough Middle Schools. All funding to come from AFG.

Staff continues to work on planning for future projects.

Cleanliness Review recommendations are being implemented. To date the \$20,000 surplus funded equipment has been sourced and will be ordered for summer delivery, and the handbook is scheduled to be completed by end of August.

Business Re-Engineering

District Allocations to Schools Review

The working committee comprised of Finance staff and a PVP representatives, has successfully concluded its work by providing school allocations with:

- Alignment of budgets in the Principal's control with the school allocation, and removal of those items that are out of the Principal's control (ie. copier lease costs);
- \$111,000 increase to school allocations
- \$48,000 increase for enrolment growth to outfit classrooms
- Collaborative solution and understanding of how school allocations will attend to positive results for students

On-Line Donations

Functionality to donate to the district, an individual school, and/or a specific initiative on-line will soon be available on school and district websites. Prior to this functionality, donations can only be made by cheque or cash at the Board Office.

School Cash On-Line Adoption Rates

In September 2019, the District undertook a significant campaign to have parents use an online application to provide consent for a variety of start-up items (breakfast programs, walking field trips, media releases etc). At the same time, school cash on-line was made available to enable the payment of fees, field trips and fundraising activities on-line.

The more payments schools can take on-line, the less cash kept and recorded in the school reducing room for error and incidence of loss and fraud. On-line payments also provide functionality and convenience for parents and streamlines work for clerical staff.

Howay Elementary

During the internal audit, fees, cashflows, receipting, and payment approvals are reviewed for compliance to the School Account Handbook. Recommendations for improvements are made and expected to be implemented by the next audit.

Audit results to date have been excellent with recommendations only on minor items.

Queen Elizabeth Elementary School Traffic Safety

Staff intend to extend the agreement with Roma Hall to continue to provide additional off-site drop off and pick up parking spaces to parents while the school works on various strategies to reduce traffic in and around the school drop off and pick-up areas. Needs for these additional parking spaces will be monitored throughout the year in consultation with the Principal.
