CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES 2017-18

Art Club (see Ms. Hunt in room 210 for details) The Art Club is a safe environment for students to explore and discover different forms of visual art.

Badminton Club (Ms. Khakaria / Mr.Sahota, Wednesdays afterschool, Massey Gym): The purpose of this club is to give students an outlet to play the sport they already enjoy, or to give the opportunity for new players to discover the sport. The main appeal is the community we create, the affordability because it's free, local, and convenient.

Bead for Life (*Ms. Buljan, Thursdays lunch, Room 231:* The purpose of the Bead for Life Club is to market and sell beads and products (bracelets, necklaces, soap) made by impoverished women in Uganda. Our goal is to raise awareness of women rights and education rights. We hope our contributions will bring the women in Uganda out of poverty and help them become independent business owners.

Best Buddies (*Ms. Maxim, Thursdays lunch, Room 127/131/233*): Best Buddies is a friendship program. We build friendships between people with and without intellectual and developmental diversity, offering mentoring while improving opportunities for social skills and inclusion. Engineering and Electronic (*Mr. Pontier, Wednesdays, lunch and afterschool, Room 156*): The Engineering and Electronic club is a club designed for students to learn, explore, and build projects. Those projects are in the field of engineering, robotic, and/or Electronics and go beyond the scope of the curriculum in those areas. The club also hosts the VEX Robotic Team. This team competes in the VEX Competitions by building a VEX EDR robot in accordance with the year's challenge. The club is also there to teach and give access to 3D printers and modeling software. Environment Club (*Mr. Somogyi, Tuesdays lunch, Room 171*): Environment Club's purpose is to raise awareness of environmental issues within the community. We strive to promote sustainability and climate justice and how they relate to politically, economically, and socially to today's world. Novel Ideas Book Club (Ms. Isaak, Tuesdays 3:15, Room 148): Members of this club will read and discuss popular literature with a focus on equality and social justice. Members of this club

read a variety of fiction and non-fiction. Discussions will revolve around how each text presents current issues and which ones are important in our changing modern world.

NWSS Create Change (Ms. Grewal, Thursdays lunch, Room 176): We believe in providing girls with confidence, an education, and opportunities to lead changes in more than their individual lives. It helps their families, their communities, and their country. Our mission is to lead a self-sufficient model of charity that is run by empowered girls. Powerful change makers dedicated to empowering others to climb out of extreme poverty. In NWSS Create Change, we also teach members to be effective at time management.
