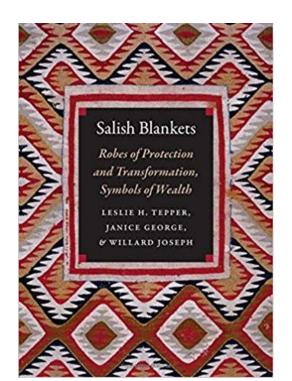


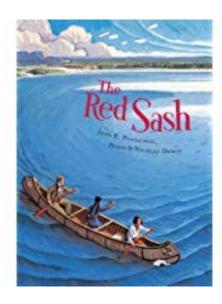












INCREASE ABORIGINAL CONTENT IN READERS AND IN CLASSROOMS

INCREASE USE OF INDIGENOUS PEDAGOGIES, LIKE GIVING STUDENTS MORE TIME FOR THOUGHTFUL REFLECTION

CONSIDER LEARNING RESOURCES FOR PARENTS FOR READING AND MATH

NO "PULL-OUT" FOR ABORIGINAL STUDENTS FOR ACADEMICS OR CULTURAL TEACHINGS; CULTURAL TEACHINGS SHOULD BE A GLOBAL ACTIVITY FOR ALL STUDENTS

PROVIDE LITERACY INTERVENTIONS FOR STRUGGLING STUDENTS IN K-4

Goal 3: Transitions

PRIORITY COMMITMENT: WORK WITH SCHOOL STAFF, PARENTS AND COMMUNITY PARTNERS TO ASSIST ABORIGINAL STUDENTS IN MAKING SMOOTH TRANSITIONS FROM ONE SCHOOL TO THE NEXT.

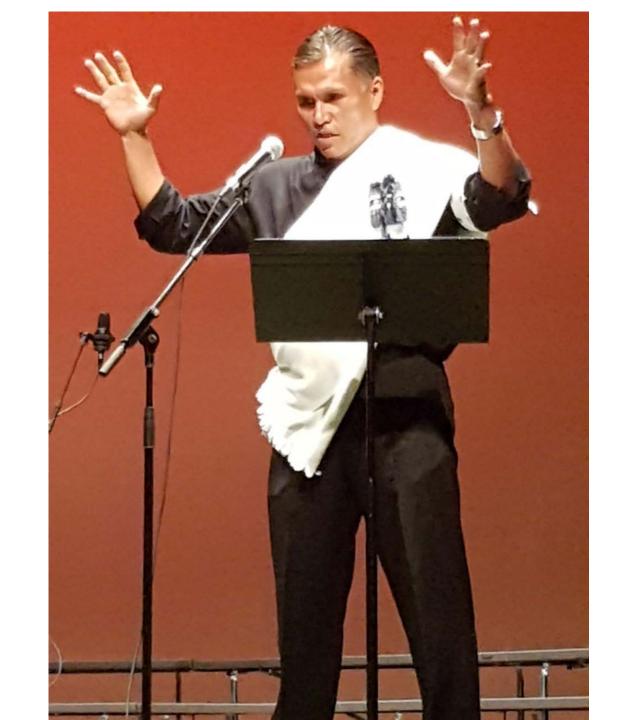
