1. Project Summary

The existing school facility is approximately 69 years old and it has reached the end of its useful life as well as being classified as H1 high seismic risk. The existing school facility is built on an area that has history of burial usage.

The project consists of design and construction of a 19,837m2 replacement facility on the existing SD owned property, decommissioning of the existing school, and restoration of the site with appropriate memorialization.

2. Project Structure

The Project Team are identified in Appendix 1.

3. Scope

The new school will accommodate more than 1,900 students with 76 teaching units and an allowable school area of 16,390m2, plus Neighbourhood Learning Centre (NLC) space of 2,802m2, and a SD Maintenance/IT facility of 645m2, for a total gross area of 19,837m2 per the CPFA.

There may be sufficient site area to accommodate two playfields and the Maintenance/IT facility is proposed as a stand-alone facility separate from the new school building.

Over the course of January:

• Civil works:

- ➤ Bottom-lift asphalt paving of laneway, parking areas and concrete curbing between Theatre and Arena was completed mid-December.
- Most civil works to Maintenance/IT building have also been completed. Fortis gas line and meter remain to be done.
- **Roadworks** laneway road-base sub-excavation, reconstruction and bottom-lift paving has been completed.
- **Drywall** Interior walls on all floors progressing well.
- **Exterior boarding** completed around the Theatre and moving towards gymnasium. Exterior cladding has arrived.
- Exterior Glazing window installation is well underway on all floors.
- M/IT Building foundations and footings are completed. Commencing with superstructure.

8. Looking into February/March:

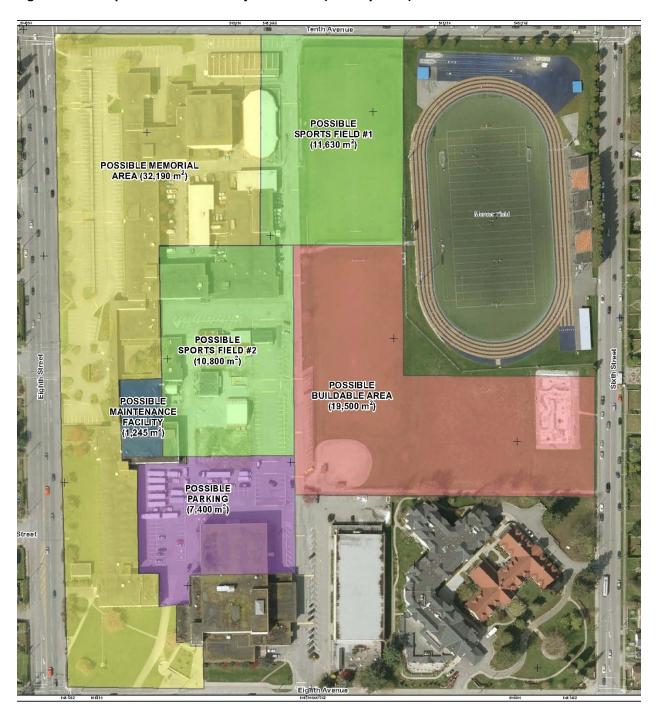

- **Exterior** insulation, lower-level concrete board and finish-cladding commencing on 6th Street frontage and working around southern face of school.
- Maintenance/IT (MIT) Building superstructure continues.
- **Site workers** current level is 120 140. Additional drywall crews have been added to Contractor's crew compliment.

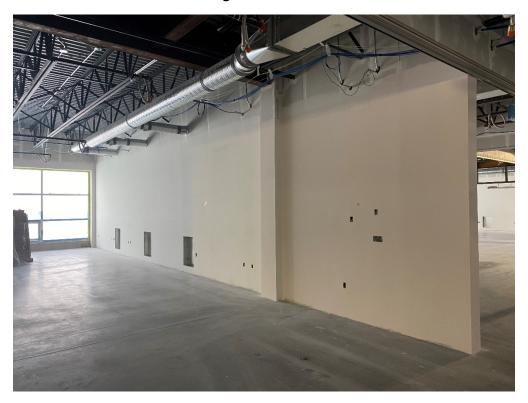

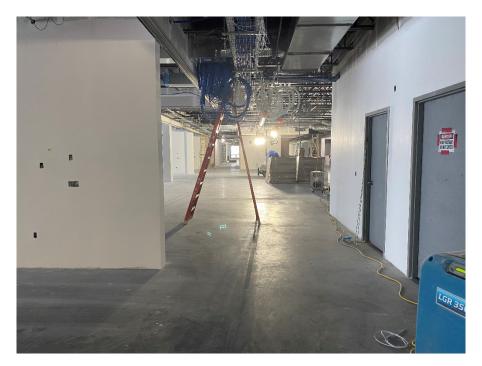


View of Glazing Installation and Insulation

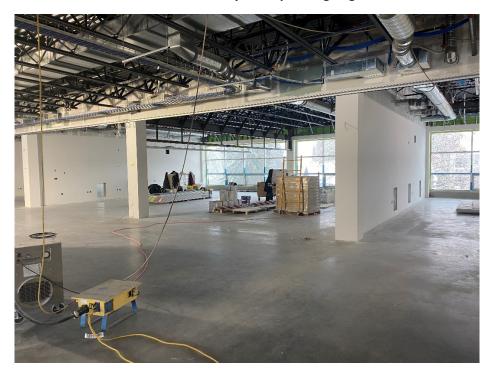


View of 3rd Floor drywall – painting begins.

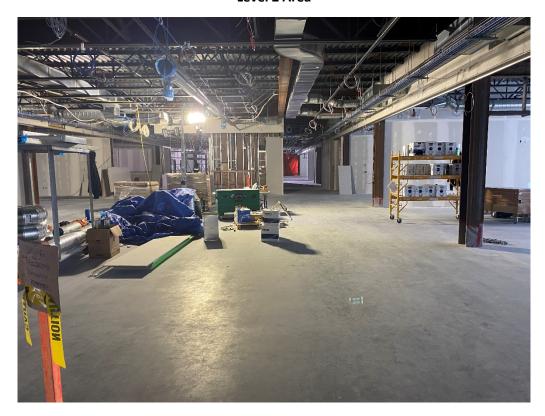


View of Level 2 floor area

Operations Update *February* 11, 2020

Capital Projects, Operations and Planning

Lord Kelvin Elementary

Sprinkler pipping refit, replacing all dry-system piping and straps, tees has been completed.

NWSS

We have been working with Murray McLeod, NWSS Principal, on how many phones and voice mails they will need for the new school. We have decided to go with MI Voice Office 250 VoIP Platform Description new phone system for NWSS and a new voice mail system for the district. Adam McMillian from Atel will be the supplier and programmer of the new phones.

We have been working on compiling all the inventory in preparation for the NWSS move. The report will be completed by February 6, 2020.

Other

Strategic Planning

The Operations team is currently working on target goals, staff training on February 14, completing projects as per 5-year capital plan, accessibility for all sites, evaluating the number of apprentices for the maintenance department, establish Green Team at middle and elementary schools.

We have reached some of our target goals: completed a Capital Project in 2019/20, the Custodial Best Practice Handbook 2019, and made available 48 daycare spaces.

Water Testing

School districts around the province are required to complete water testing on all school facilities once every 3 years. Since this requirement was put in place, to date, none of New Westminster Schools' sites tested have come back with any levels above the maximum acceptable concentrations. This year, the district will be conducting the annual lead testing by the end of March 2020 at Lord Kelvin, FW Howay, and Herbert Spencer Elementary schools, as well as Glenbrook and Queensborough Middle schools.

The last lead test conducted at NWSS was in March 2019. The lead levels came in below the maximum acceptable concentrations for all chemical and bacteriological health-related guidelines for Canadian Drinking Water Quality parameters. The tests were completed by a third party and results sent directly to the Ministry of Education. The district had originally posted signs, as a precaution, to run the water but this is unnecessary based on the results and, therefore, the signs have since been removed. The water is completely safe.

Finance

Presently the finance department is working on issuing T4's to staff, which will be sent out by the middle of February.

A significant amount of work is also being put in for the amended budget for 2019-20 and the preliminary budget for 2020-21.

Background:

Annually, the amended budget is due at the end of February. In December of each year, the Ministry provides a grant recalculation based on the September 1701 enrolment capture. Below is an analysis of the various categories which have changed.

Revenues

Overall, the District anticipates an overall reduction in revenues of \$1,395,093. This is predominantly caused by a reduction in the operating grant of \$1.8M from the preliminary budget submitted offset by anticipated increases in international education where we are able to recognize deferred revenue balances (\$313K) in the year and increases anticipated for interest (\$100K) and rental income (\$55K). The reduction in the operating grant stems mainly from the decrease in Full Time Equivalent (FTE) claimed in the area of continuing education and distributed learning.

Not reflected in operating revenues is additional funding the District received for 8.0 FTE in Classroom Enhancement Fund (CEF) staffing due to a previous under-claim (not due to enrolment growth). The net increase to funding from CEF, after a decrease in remedies funding was \$738,274. This effectively allows the district to charge staffing costs against this fund, which would have otherwise been charged to the operating fund.

Expenses

In November 2019, meetings were conducted with department leads for learning services, Human Resources, Technical Information Services (TIS) and Maintenance to obtain a better understanding of needs for the remainder of the year. Adjustments as necessary were made to reflect anticipated results. The District also made every effort to ensure the special purpose grant funding was utilized – specifically, CEF, Community Link. The district also enhanced its precision of salaries and benefits and are able to capture true costs of staff in buildings rather than using average teacher costs.

Notes 1 / 2 – In October 2019 the Board approved \$625,000 in surplus appropriation as a result of increased costs for supports for students with special needs \$105,099, Medical Services Plan (MSP) payments for international students of \$136,000, and late 2018-19 carry-forward balances of \$91,723. In addition to these cost pressures, \$291,000 related to enrolment funding pressures to revenue. The costs noted here represent these cost pressures. Note that the \$291K is reflected in the updates to revenues balances and is included in the overall revenue reduction of \$1,395,093.

<u>Note 3</u> – Given the International program is undergoing changes due to space constraints in the district, we have made efforts to reduce the supplies and services costs. Offsetting reductions of over \$40,000, allocations were made to supplement learning resources to school sites in the amount of \$56,834 resulting in a net investment of \$14,434.

Note 4 – The largest adjustment made to supplies relates to natural gas. Last year, due to the ruptured pipe in Alberta, the cost of gas increased substantially. This year, the rates have returned to normal and we are able to realize a savings compared to the anticipated cost, which were pegged to prior year expenses. The reduction in anticipated gas costs is \$160,000.

<u>Note 5</u> – Salaries adjustments come from all groups – CUPE, Teachers, and Exempt staff. Due to the ability to utilize special purpose funds, we were able to optimize those accounts which had a positive effect on expenses.

<u>Note 6</u> – Due to the adjustment in salaries we were able to realize a savings in benefits as well of approximately \$140,700. The remainder of the decrease is enhancing the overall precision of benefits calculations.

<u>Note 7</u> – The District will revisit the implementation of multi-functional devices and digitization of workflows. The anticipated cost of this initiative was \$150,000, which represents a savings, however, an additional \$50,000 was required for IT infrastructure and another \$50,000 repurposed to hire an IT consultant to assess the district's state and assist in next steps.

<u>Note 8</u> – The ministry would like us to report this as a special purpose fund. Both the revenue and expenses have been moved to a different fund.

Prior to the start of the school year, the board had approved to utilize \$928,932 of its accumulated surplus balance. An additional request was made in October 2019 for \$625,000. Given the above savings realized of well over \$1M, the \$625,000 originally requested will no longer need to be utilized.



The district is still anticipating the use of accumulated surplus, however, rather than \$928,932, \$840,936 will be utilized for operating purposes.

Finally, the District is required to contribute \$1,000,000 to the McBride replacement project. This funding needs to come from the accumulated surplus reserve and is over and above the \$840,936 noted above. Please see below for the recommendation relating to this request. Not contemplated yet are the furniture and equipment that will need to be purchased for NWSS through the use of surplus funds.
