# Chair Report

Anita Ansari November 2019 to November 2020

I began the Chair role on November 26<sup>th</sup> of 2019. In the time since, highlights of what we've accomplished, the milestone markers and the big-picture decisions included:

- 1. Secured funding for a new building to replace current Richard McBride Elementary.
- 2. Carried out a budget consultation with students, teachers, parents and staff, to understand how to prioritize our needs as a community in support of our strategic vision.
- 3. Made the difficult decision to reduce our continued education offerings, due to budget limitations.
- 4. Increased childcare spaces to provide more opportunities to families:
  - Richard McBride 15 spaces.
  - F.W. Howay 30 spaces.
  - Connaught Heights 25 spaces (ages 3–5).
  - Queensborough 30 new spaces added.
- 5. Carried out an Inclusive Education review, consulting with students, parents, educators and building a report and a multi-year roadmap for how to build on our success and how to address the gaps we uncovered.
- 6. Adapted to the COVID-19 pandemic:
  - Suspended in-person classes.
  - Engaged principals / teachers / CUPE / staff to provide education remotely.
  - Sent out surveys to parents to check-in with their needs and identify Essential Service families; got back 4,000 responses.
  - Opened a number of Child Learning Centres for Essential Service families; supported approximately 55 students in four after-school sites in partnership with our childcare partners, with certified teachers there through regular school hours to support students in their remote learning needs.
  - Upgraded technological capabilities of school district Microsoft Teams rollout; training for teachers on using our remote technology.
  - Disbursed community link funding through gift cards for groceries, so our families could cover the meals we used to provide at our sites for our vulnerable students.
  - Loaned out close to 1000 Chromebooks; worked with internet service providers to connect families in our district who did not have Wi-Fi.

- Repatriated 71 International students 63 of them remained with us.
- In June, moved to Stage 3 of COVID Education Framework, with in-class and remote learning, density targets, and full time instruction for essential service families.
- Hosted three days of live, low density graduation ceremonies at the Anvil Centre, with a virtual ceremony of the recorded events shared on what had been the scheduled day for the original ceremony.
- Worked with BC Housing, the City, Fraser Health and the Lookout Society to set up an Emergency Housing Centre in the Massey gyms.
- In September, moved to Stage 2 of COVID Education Framework surveyed families and employees to figure out how to accommodate the needs of people in our school community. Applied provincial funding and federal funding to relieve COVID cost pressures
- 7. Managed schedule challenges around the build of the new NWSS in light of a reduction in tradespersons on site and supply chain issues. A delay that should soon be behind us as we look towards opening it soon.
- 8. Received permits to start earthworks/excavation at McBride site on March  $31^{st}$  and kept on building it.
- 9. NWSS students won the Game of Apps current Provincial app-making champions.
- 10. Made a formal commitment on behalf of the Board and the District to develop and adopt an anti-racism policy.
- 11. Hired a District Vice Principal of Early Education (Tanis Anderson), a District Principal of Equity and Inclusion (Rav Johal, starting in January).
- 12. Tackled Climate Action, to see what we could do operationally and educationally.
- 13. Engaged staff to start the process of becoming a Living Wage Certified Employer.

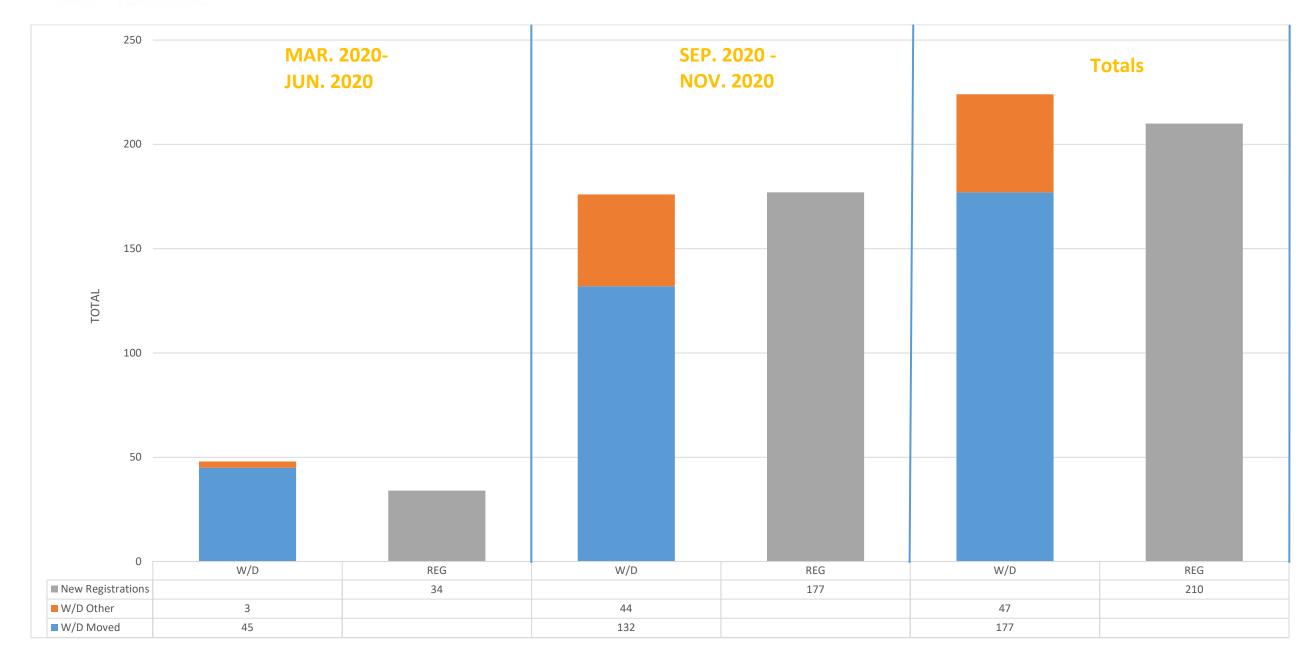
