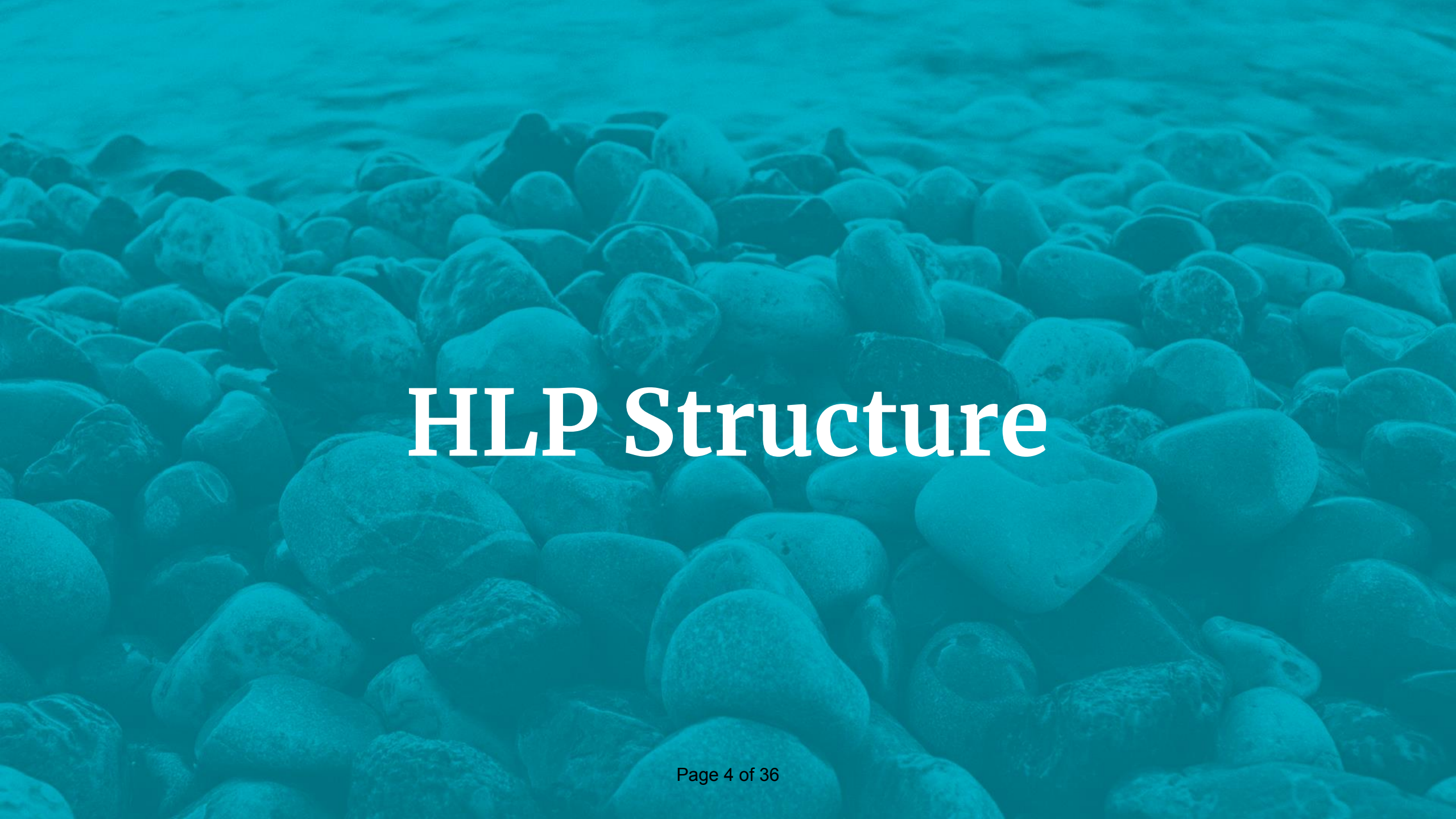

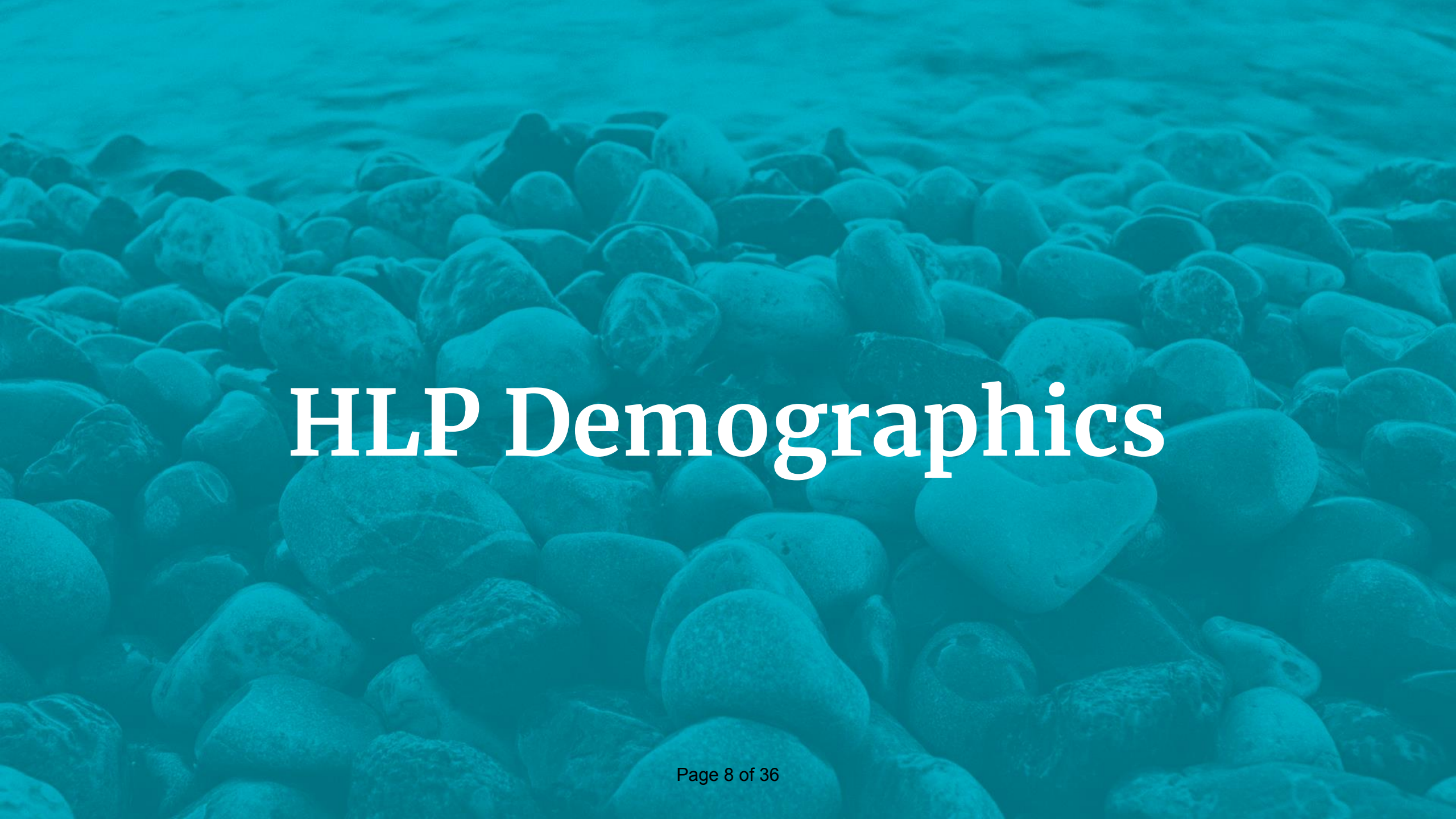

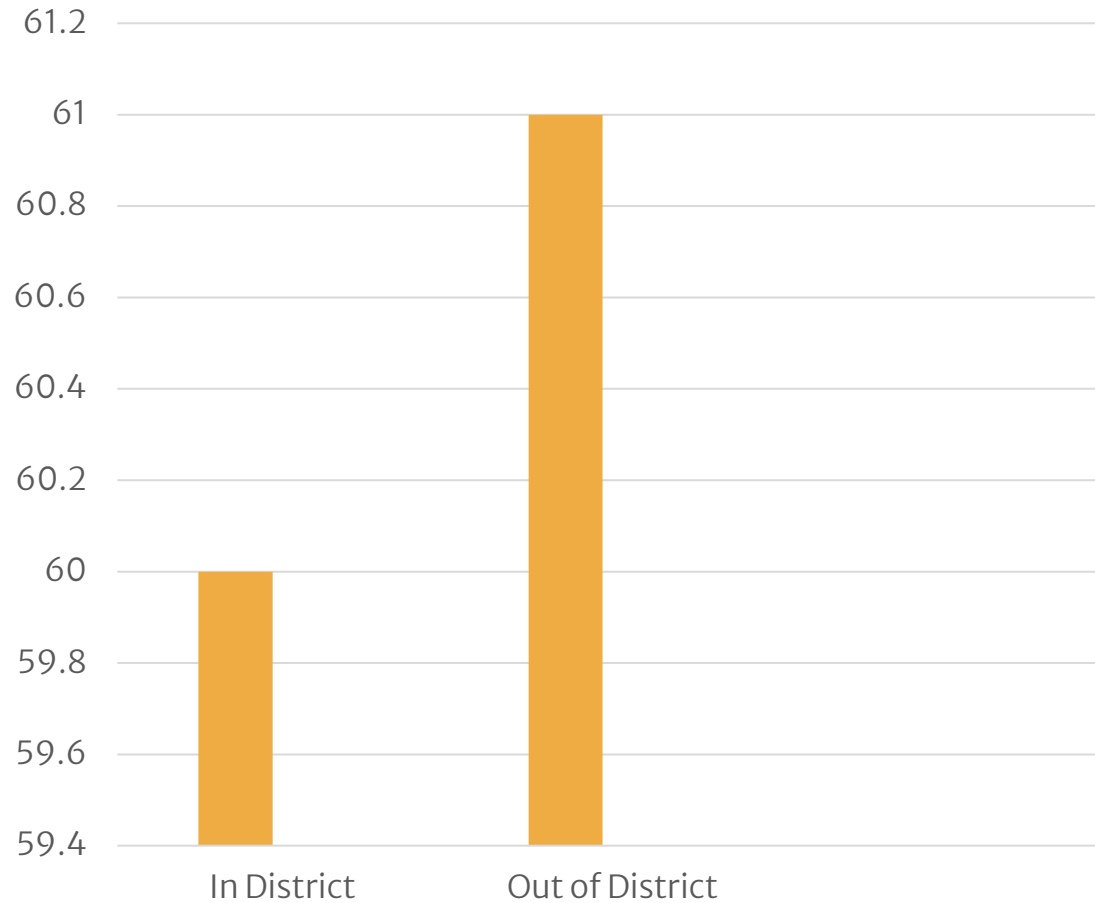

HLP Current Enrollment

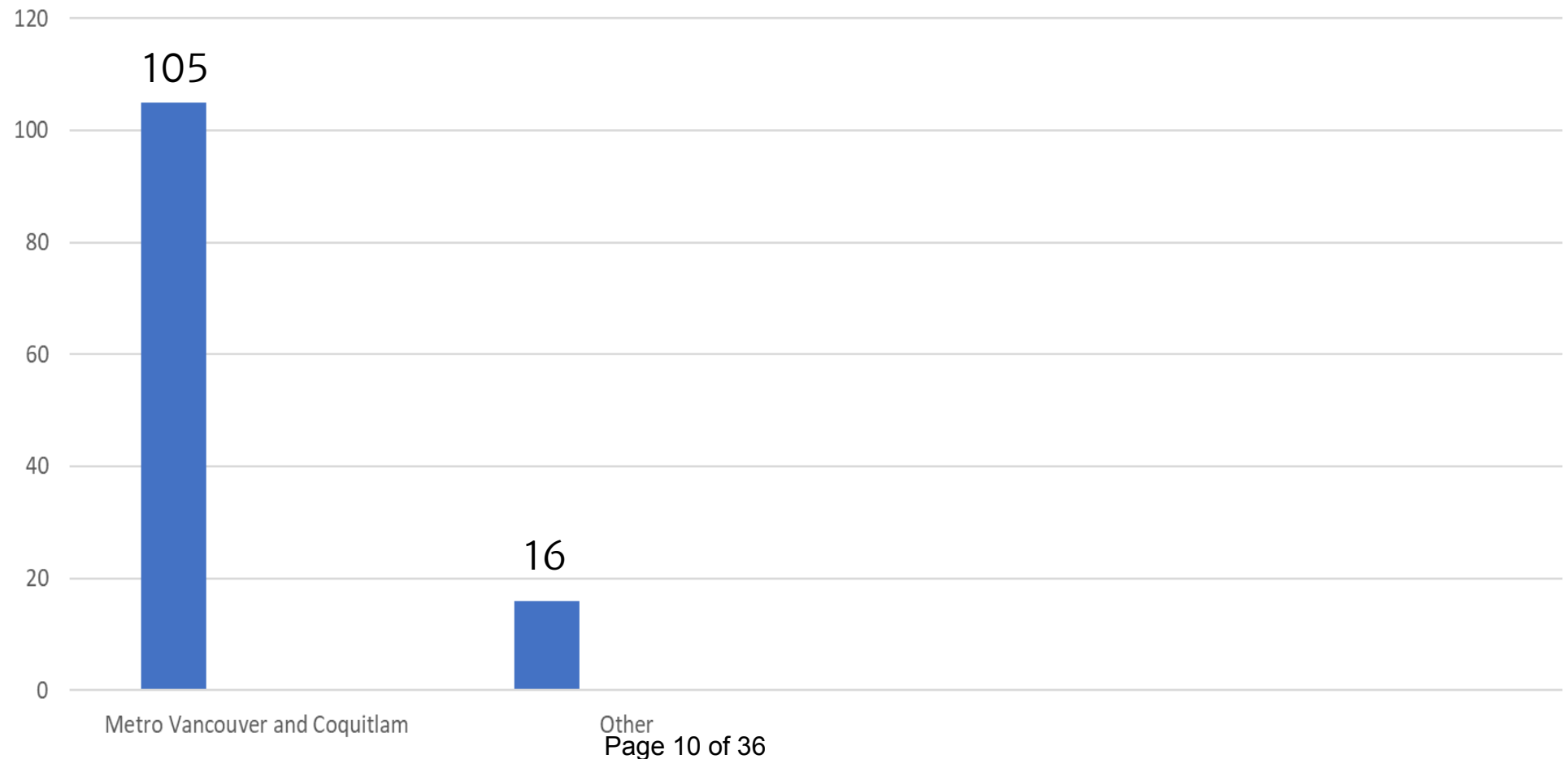
HLP Enrollment



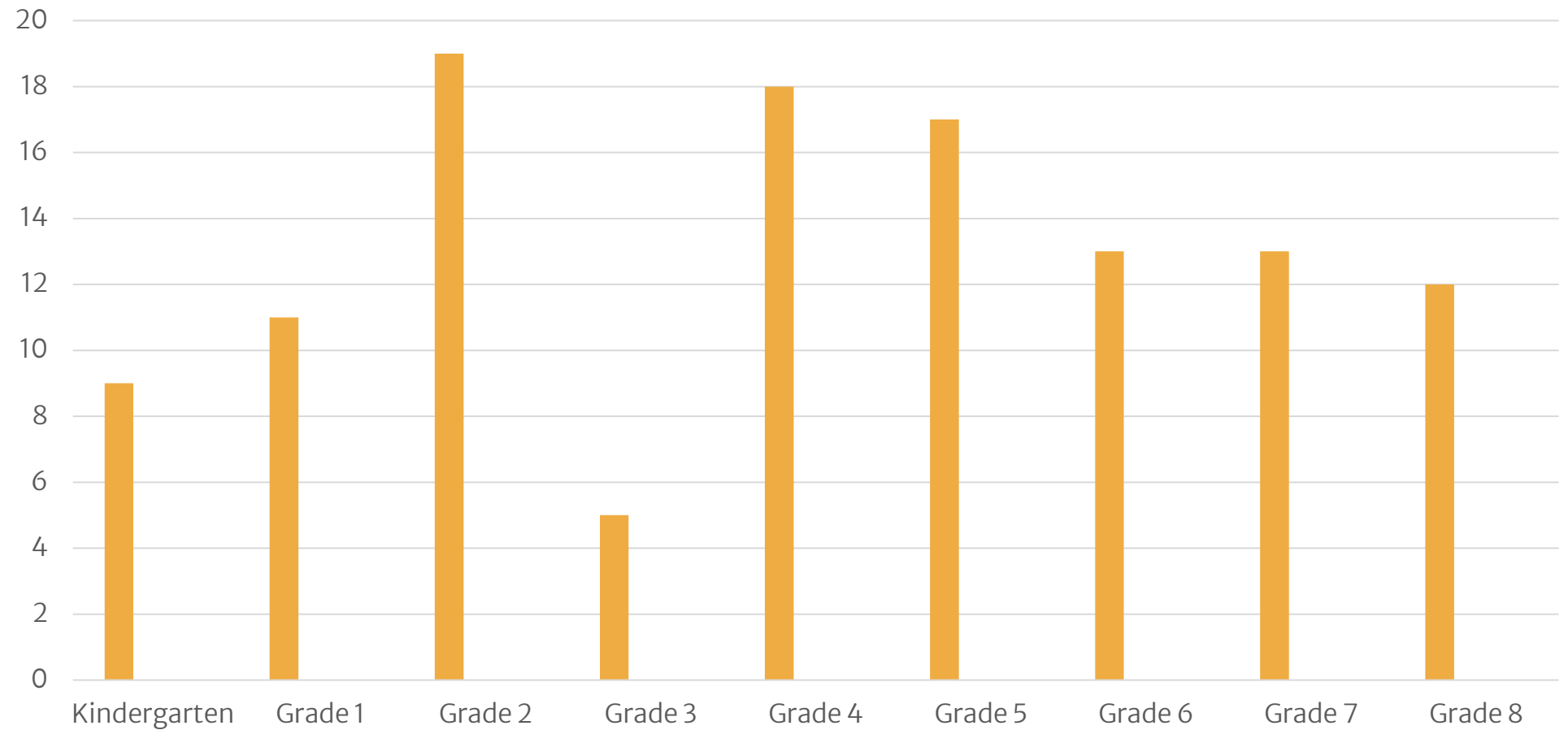

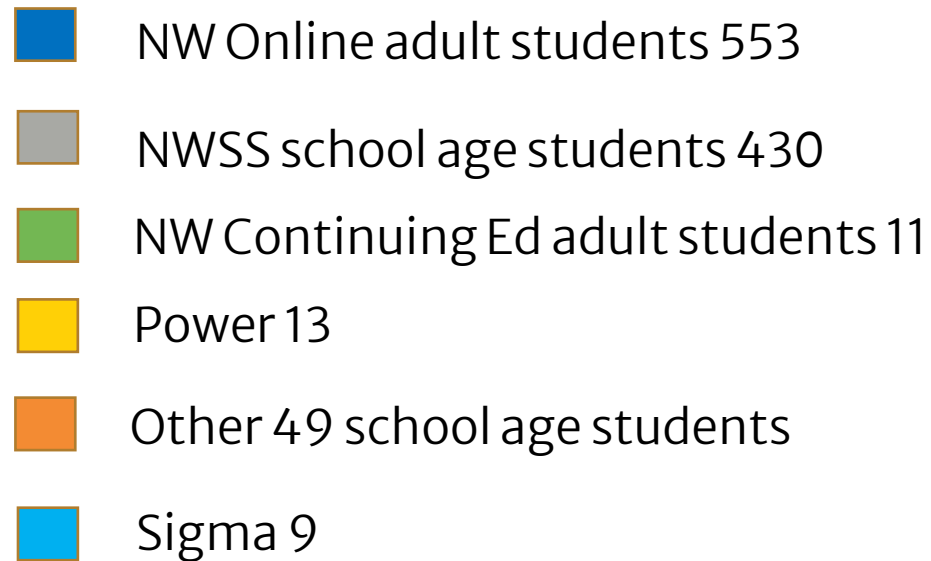

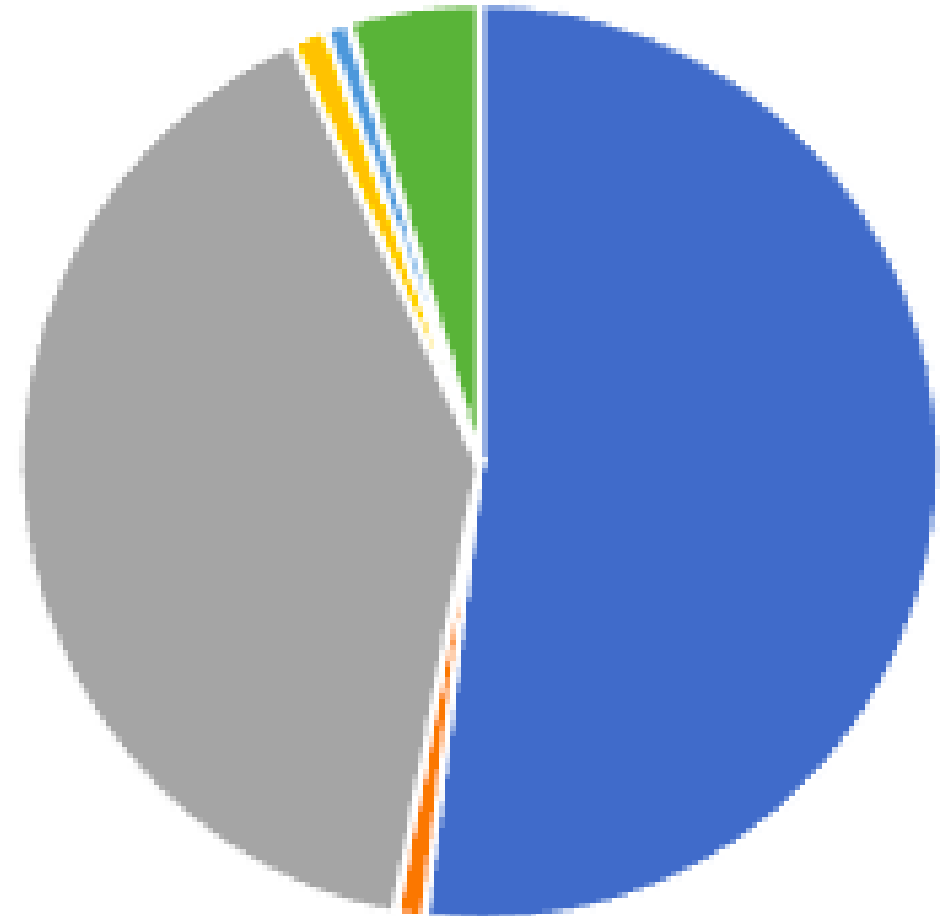
How Alcohol Affects The Brain



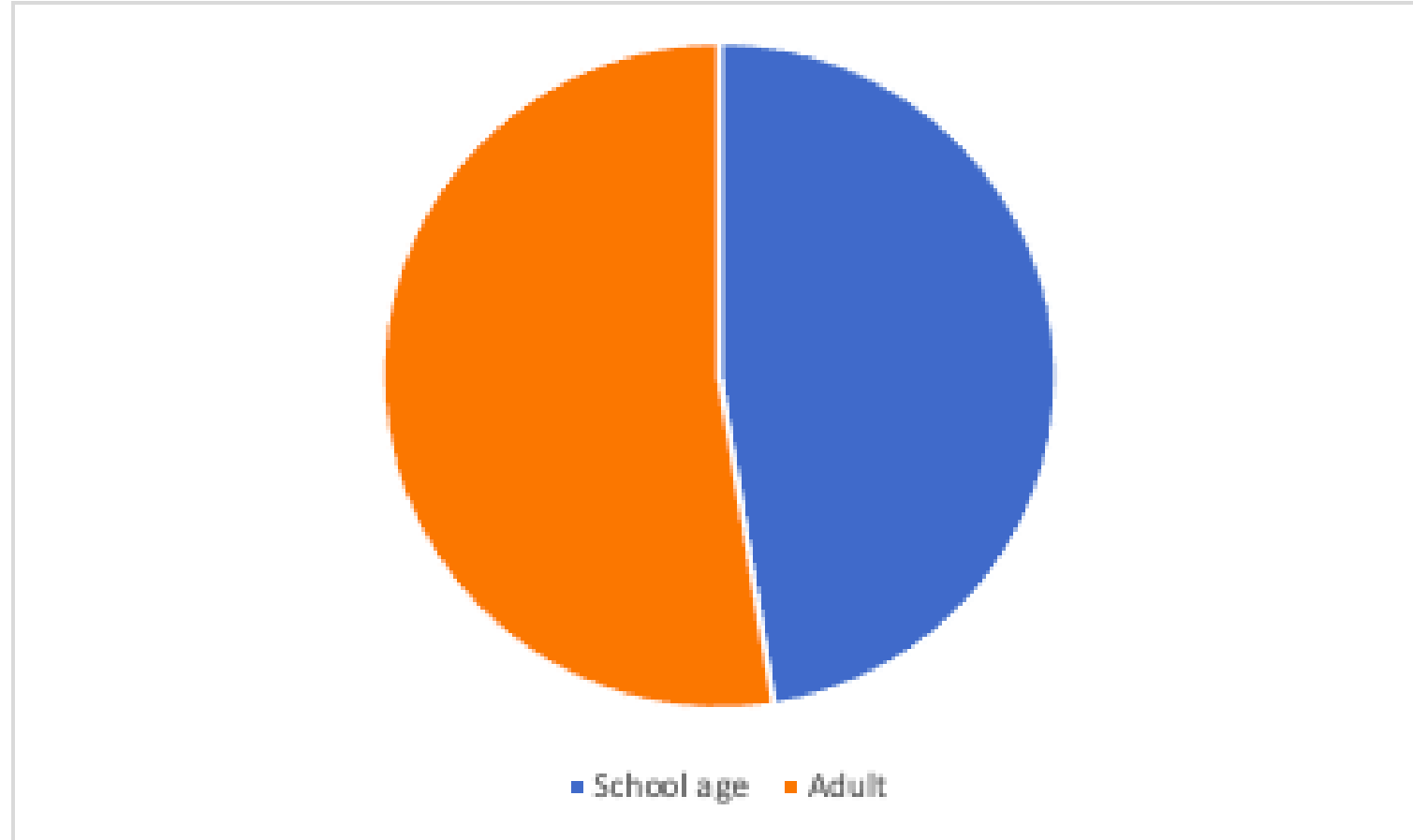
Enrolment (School age and adults)

(December 2021)



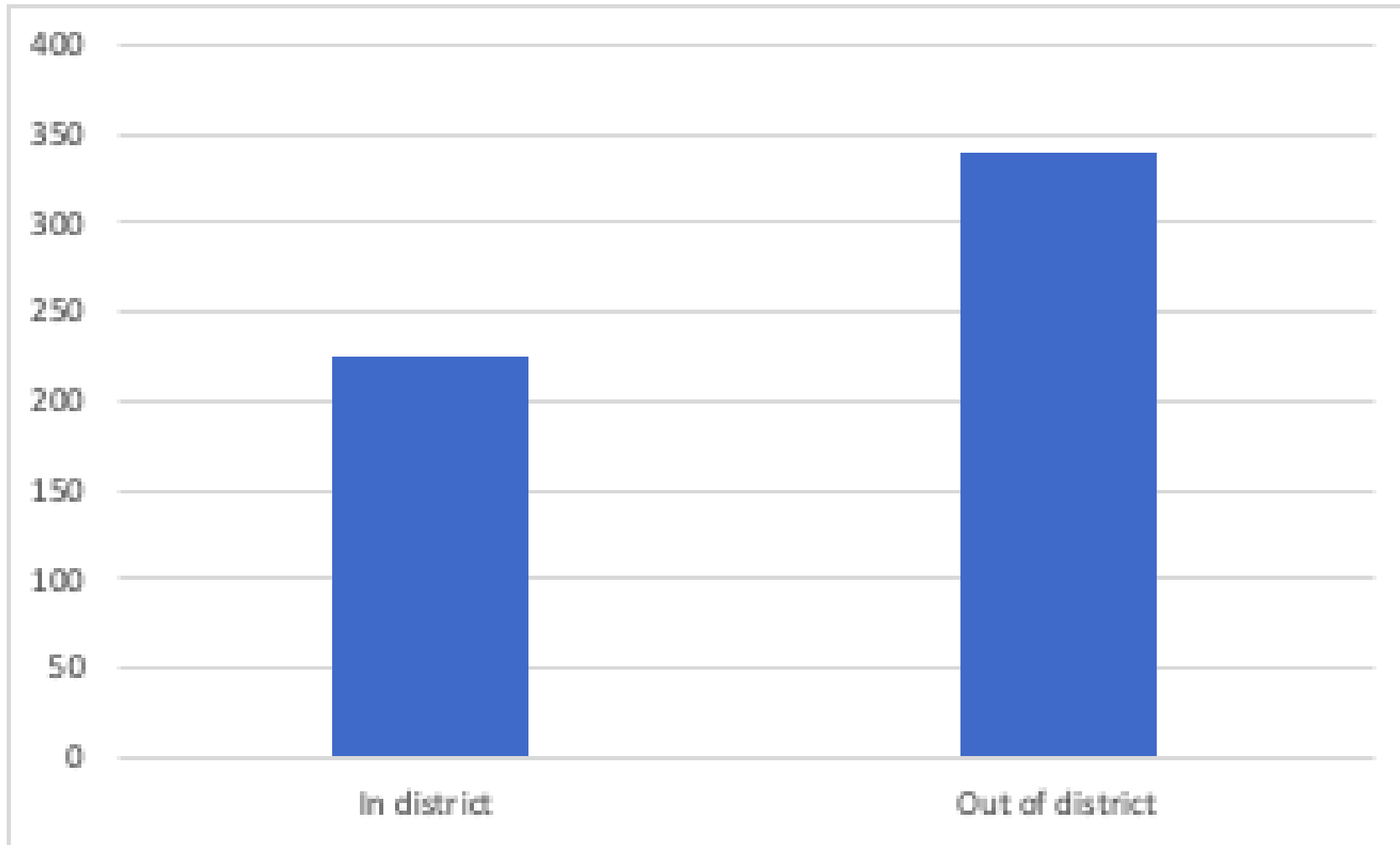
Enrolment – School Age vs Adult

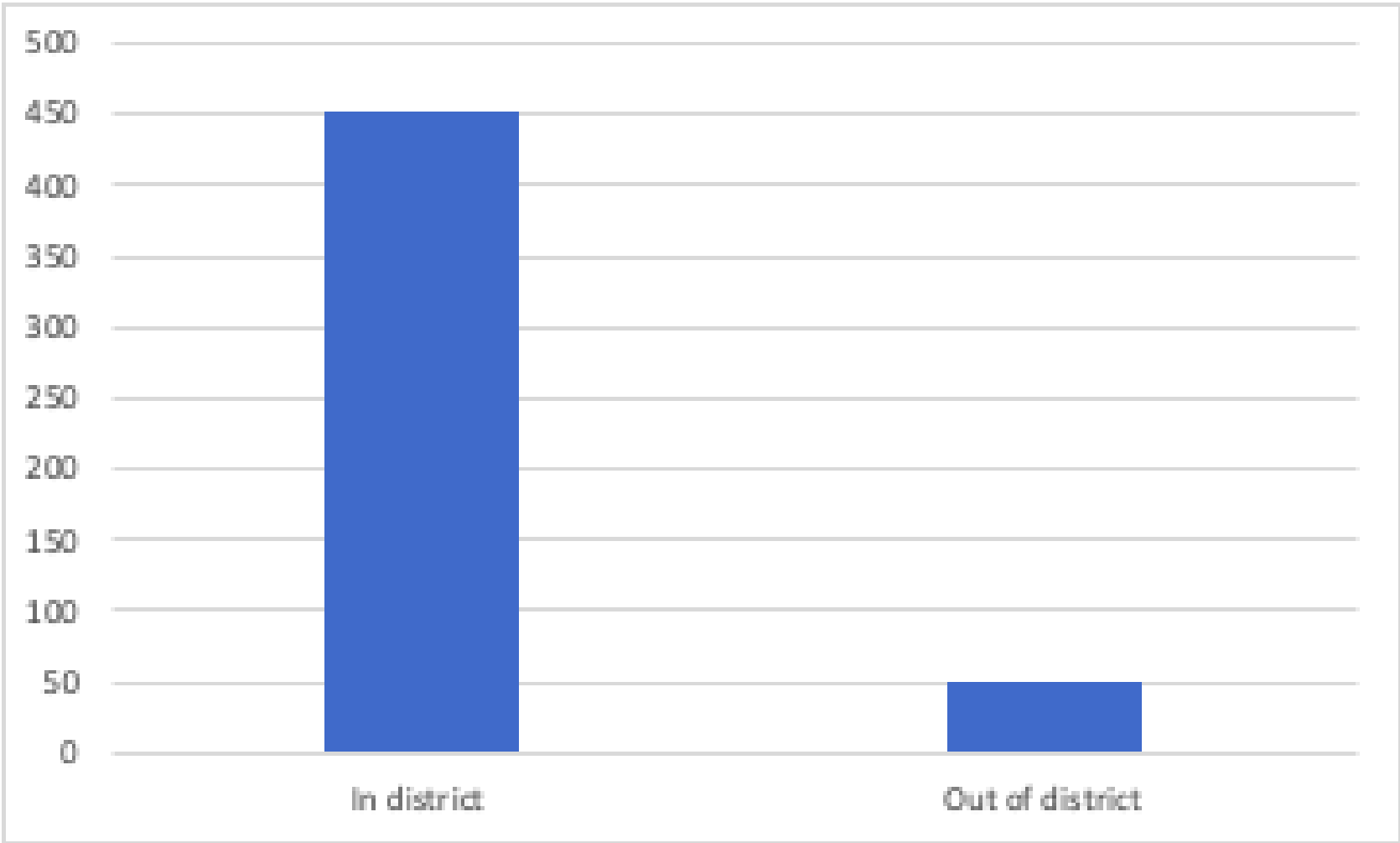
Adults – In vs Out of District

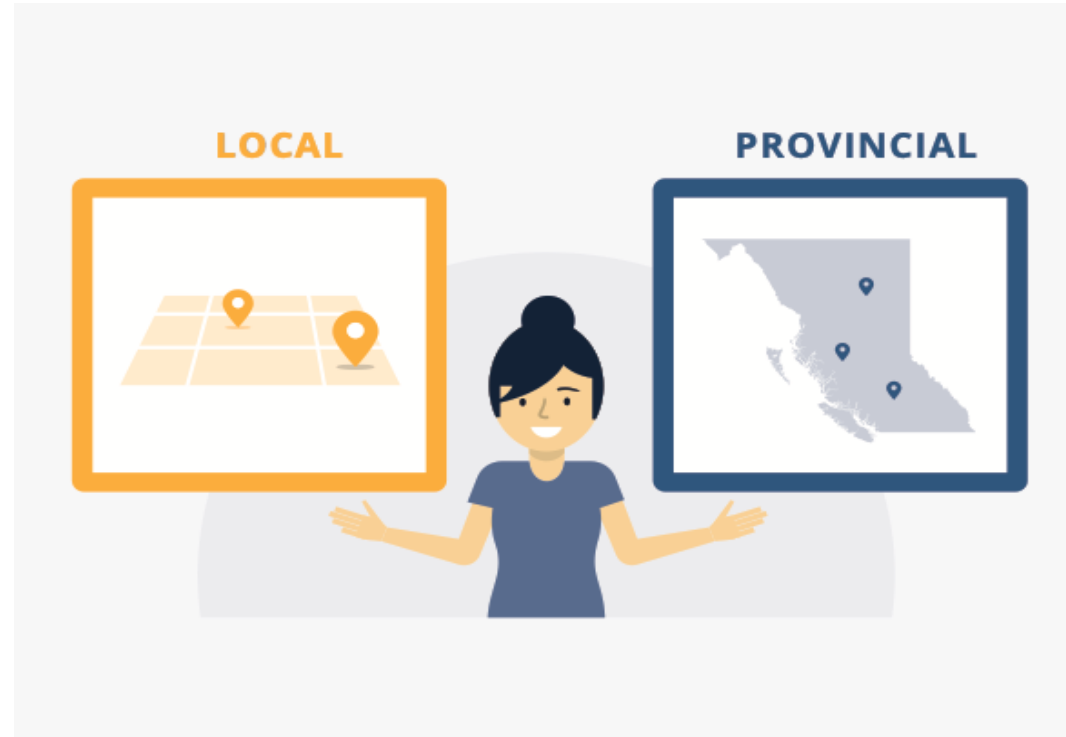

POLS

This means if a local online learning school doesn't have the course or program a student wants, they can explore other options with provincial online learning schools.

Online Learning Policy Definitions

- ❑ **METHOD OF INSTRUCTION THAT RELIES *PRIMARILY* ON COMMUNICATION BETWEEN STUDENTS AND TEACHERS *BY MEANS OF THE INTERNET***
- ❑ **MAY ALSO INCLUDE OTHER TYPES OF INSTRUCTION *AT A DISTANCE* FROM THE LEARNER, SUCH AS:**
 - Correspondence
 - Web Conferencing
 - Teleconferencing
 - In-person support services

Implications for New Westminster Schools

❑ HUME PARK: DEFINITION OF ON-LINE SCHOOL NOT ALIGNED WITH CURRENT PROGRAM

Options currently being considered:

- ❑ Become a POLS – Expression of Interest
- ❑ Operate as a Program of Choice at Hume Park implementing any ministry required adjustments
- ❑ Work with Ministry of Education to address gap created by policy revision – update anticipated

❑ NW ONLINE: OUT OF DISTRICT STUDENTS CAN ONLY BE SERVED BY POLS

OPTIONS CURRENTLY BEING CONSIDERED:

- ❑ Expression of Interest to become a POLS submitted
- ❑ Consideration of capacity to deliver services as a POL

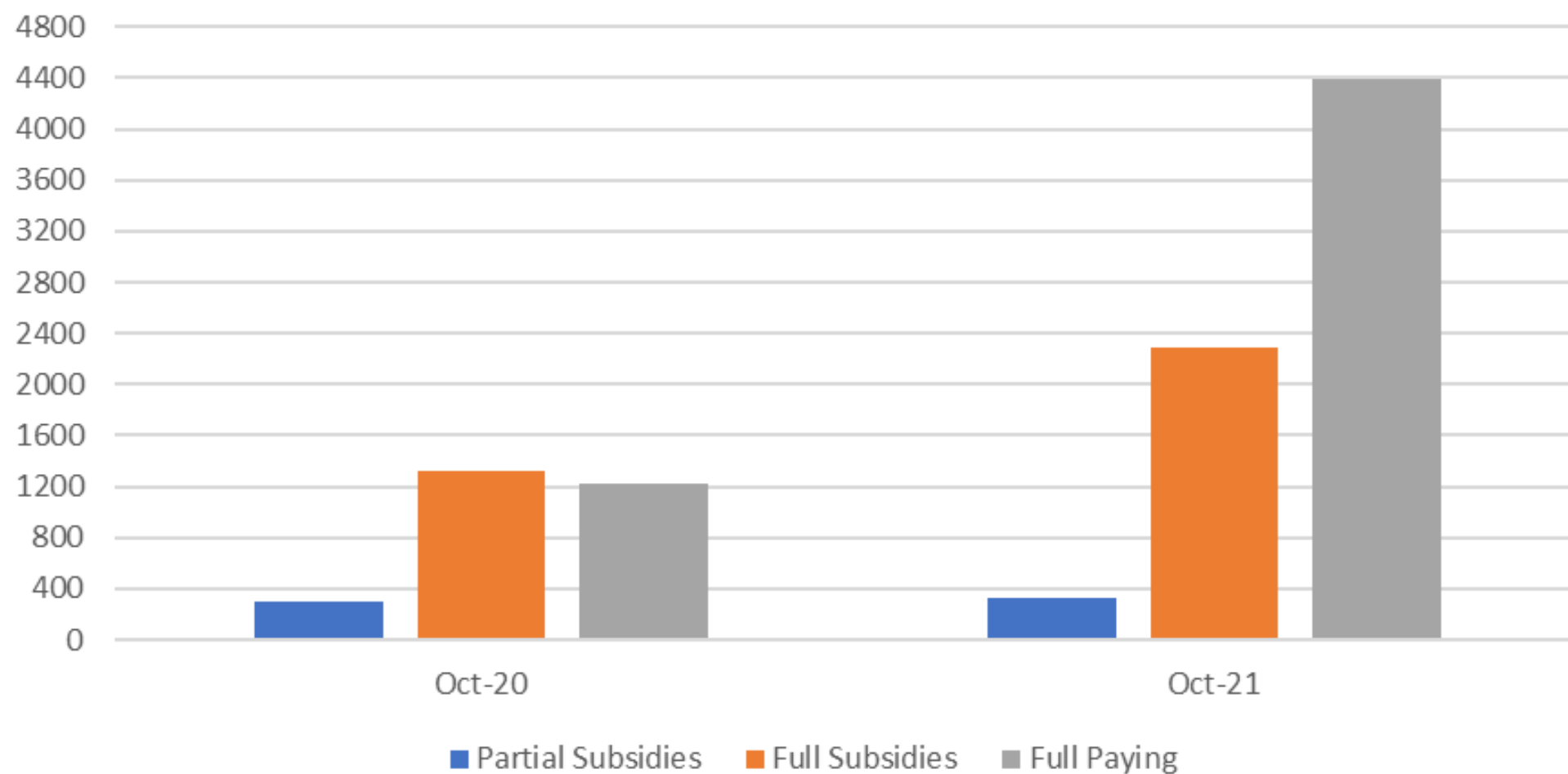
Updates

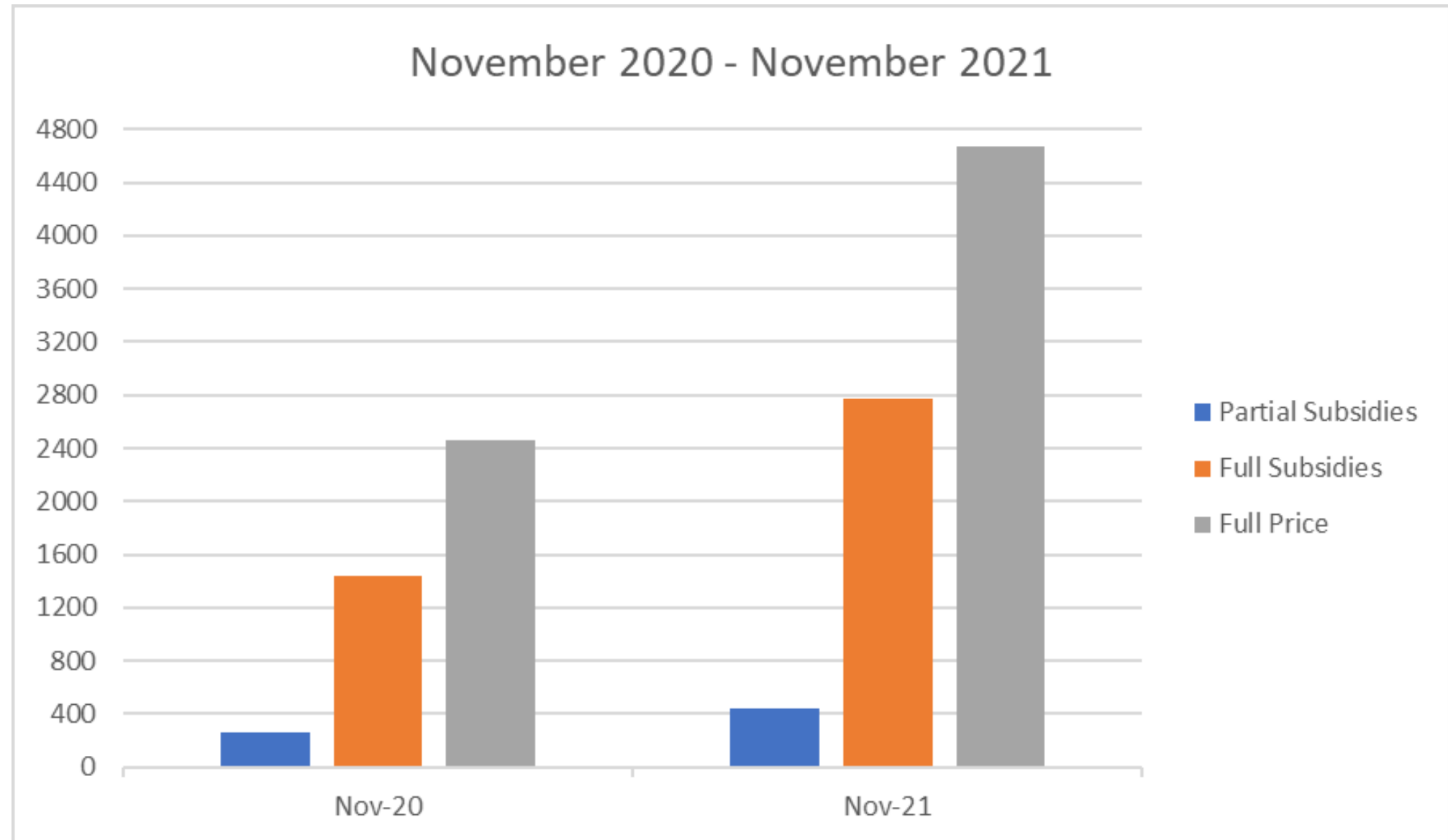
- Meet twice a month with Simply Foods
- Advertising has increased through school district and social media
- Barriers have been removed when applying for subsidy
- Balance between "kid friendly foods" and exposing students to new foods

- Increase in number of families participating in our district nourishment program paying full price
- Typically order 2-3 days a week, as well as on "Fun Lunch days"
- Even with proceeds coming from full paying families, this does not significantly offset our costs

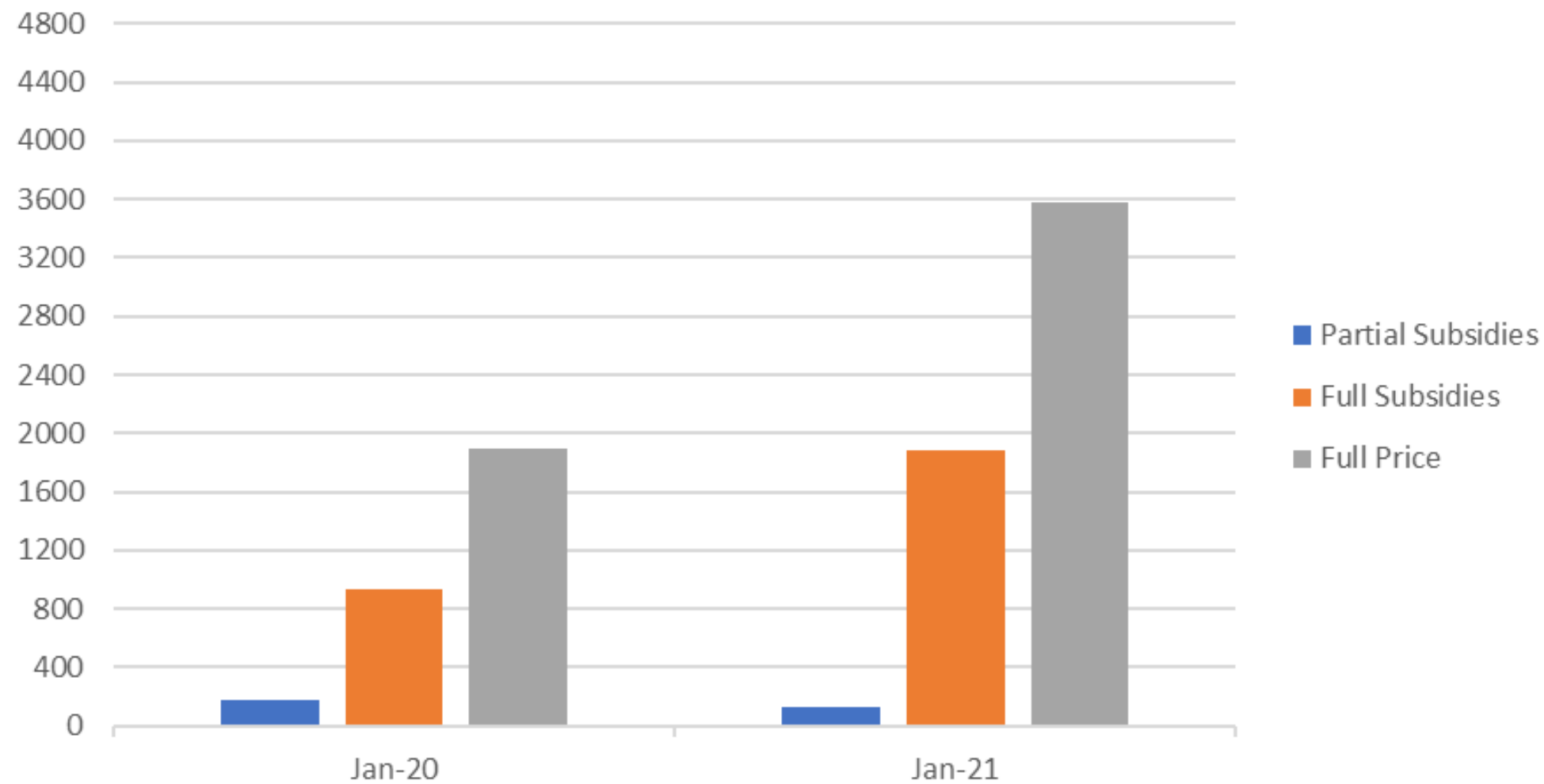


October 2020 - October 2021



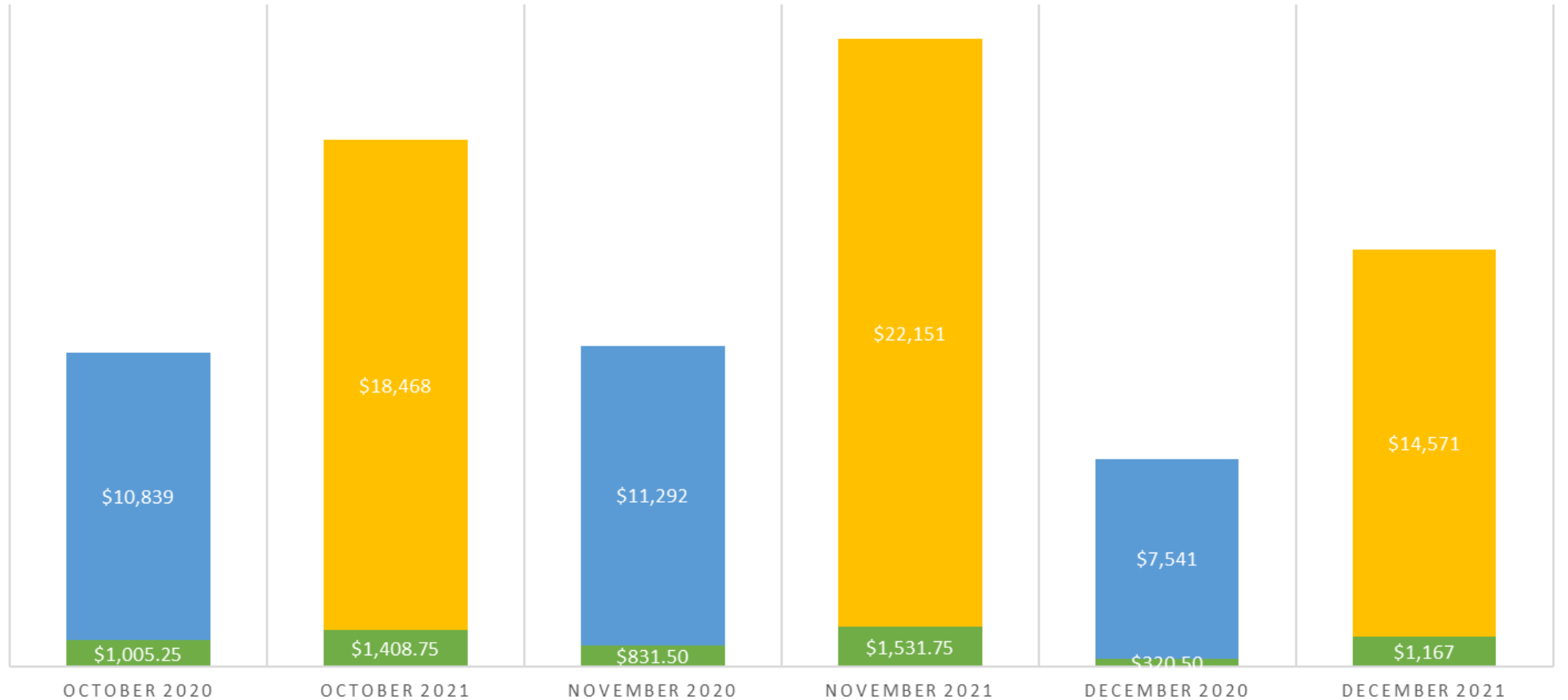


December 2020 - December 2021
