- Discuss: Have open and honest conversations with your family members about cultural appropriation when it arises. Also, discuss what creative costumes you can make or purchase to avoid causing harm to others.
- Act: Let's create fun, safe and exciting communities and commit to being antiracist by following these respectful guidelines and actively stopping cultural appropriation.
