New Westminster Secondary School Learning Plan October 2023 - 2024




THE CURRENT CONTEXT

- New Westminster Secondary School (NWSS) of New Westminster, BC, currently has 2300 Grade 9 12 students. We support a very diverse population. At NWSS, there are many strong connections among staff, students, parents and the community. As the primary secondary school in the city, NWSS offers many different types of programs for students including International Baccalaureate, Construction Diplomas, Red Seal Apprenticeships, Alternate Education, French Immersion, Sports Academies, and one of the online virtual schools in BC. We continue to be a school that exemplifies resiliency, flexibility and collaborative work ethic of our staff and students.
- SLP Background: Last year we focused on creating a **Collaborative** learning environment where students feel **Connected** to a learning **Community** that **Celebrates** diversity and clearly **Communicates** equitable and inclusive opportunities for all learners (5 C's). Surveys revealed that students, parents and staff strive to have a stronger sense of connectedness at NWSS and that redefining the school culture given the current educational landscape would be our most important work moving f orward into the 2023-24 school year.
